PRESIDENTIAL

ANAN EXPLORING NEW FRONTIERS, IMPROVING PROCESS - PRESIDENT

he President, Association of National Accountants of Nigeria, Prof. Benjamin Chuka Osisioma has given his administration's scorecard in the last 10 months.

Speaking during his first official address on Monday 21st February, 2022, the President said ANAN has evolved innovative models of education, training and examinations at the Nigerian College of Accountancy, Kwall and ANAN University, Kwall in Plateau State.

He noted that in 2022, the Association created a new system of digital examination for all study centres for robust automation of process and convenience.

The President further said the Association is on course in enhancing its branding campaigns through increased media engagements and publicity.

He urged members to be more committed in subscription payment and financial support to the Association in realizing its developmental objectives. In improving professional capacity, the President said the Governing Council has broadened the Mandatory Continuing Professional Development (MCPD) programme structure by adding 2 sessions in Abuja and Lagos, making it a cumulative of 8 sessions in a year.

He said this is designed to have more diverse study themes to enable members gain more liberty of choice in accordance with their specializations and expertise.

On the rationale for the Bill to amend ANAN Act 1993 in the National Assembly, the President explained that it is designed to incorporate new developments in the Association, such as ANAN new Headquarters address in Abuja, ANAN new Logo and emerging specializations in the Accountancy profession to fit with contemporary times.

The President said the Association is in good working relations with sister professional bodies and continually improving processes for more valuable results.


